Haggai 2:1-5
The Lord encourages his people

On October 17 of that same year, the Lord sent a message through the prophet Haggai. ² "Say this to Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, and to Jeshua son of Jehozadak, the high priest, and to the remnant of God's people there in the land: ³ 'Does anyone remember this house—this Temple—in its former splendour? How, in comparison, does it look to you now? It must seem like nothing at all! ⁴ But now the Lord says:

Be strong, Zerubbabel.

Be strong, Jeshua son of Jehozadak, the high priest.

Be strong, all you people still left in the land.

And **now get to work**, for I am with you, says the Lord of Heaven's Armies. My Spirit remains among you, just as I promised when you came out of Egypt. So do not be afraid

Background

The context of the bible reading was that King Cyrus of Persia issued a decree in 539BC for Jewish exiles in in Babylonia could return to Jerusalem and rebuild the temple Ezra 4:1-5,24.

19 years later in 520BC, Haggai comes on to the scene and in his 2nd prophecy, when everyone was discouraged because they had experienced such opposition from the Samaritans, the rebuilding of the temple had come to a halt.

The Jewish people and their nation had diminished and declined from the time of Solomon with the Temple in all its splendour and the nation being made up of the 12 tribes. Decline did not happen overnight but over years where there were key moments in it, such as in 722BC when the 10 Northern tribes went into exile and the in 586BC the 2 southern tribes did the same.

We are reminded in Genesis that we are created by God for work. John Stott helpfully defines work as, [the]

"Expenditure of energy manual or mental or both, in the service of others, which brings fulfilment to the worker, benefit to the community, and glory to God."

The key principle to being wise at work in Proverbs is seen in:

Proverbs 9:10

The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and knowledge of the Holy One is understanding.

Version 2 Respecting and obeying the Lord is the foundation of wisdom. Knowledge of the Holy One leads to understanding.

Which results in being wise by making good decisions and choices in life, discerning and doing what is right.

Being wise means "Saying or doing the right thing – and at the right time in the right way" – **RT Kendal**

Wisdom is having the ability to get the right things done.

Wisdom is about making good decisions now that you will be happy with later.

Wisdom is about getting God's opinion on any matter and discerning the mind of Christ.

A living, vital relationship with the Lord is a prerequisite for God's Wisdom in our lives.

Diligence and hard work

Proverbs 13:4 NLT Lazy people want much but get little, but those who work hard will prosper.

Proverbs 18:9 NLT A lazy person is as bad as someone who destroys things.

Diligence is a vital part of wise living.

Integrity and honesty

Proverbs 28:20-25 NLT

The trustworthy person will get a rich reward, but a person who wants quick riches will get into trouble.

- ²¹ Showing partiality is never good (bribery), yet some will do wrong for a mere piece of bread.
- ²² Greedy people try to get rich quick (make a prophet through being unwilling to pay well or spend or invest at appropriate times) but don't realize they're headed for poverty.
- ²³ In the end, people appreciate honest criticism far more than flattery. (Other people use deceptive business practises)
- ²⁴ Anyone who steals from his father and mother and says, "What's wrong with that?" is no better than a murderer. (Exploit vulnerable people)
- ²⁵ Greed causes fighting; or evoke hostile opposition by being too ruthless) trusting the Lord leads to prosperity

Colossians 4:1 Masters, be just and fair to your slaves. Remember that you also have a Master—in heaven

Colossians 3:23-24 Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as though you were working for the Lord and not for people. ²⁴ Remember that the Lord will give you an inheritance as your reward. For Christ is the real Master you serve.

Galatians 6:4 Pay careful attention to your own work, for then you will get the satisfaction of a job well done, and you won't need to compare yourself to anyone else.
